WHERE ARE WE NOW All the 95 out of the 97 items required for each Polling Station have been distributed to all 216 districts of the country.

Voters Register, Supplementary Lists and Polling Station Lists have all been given to the parties and candidates.

Polling Station list and locations have been shared with security agencies and observers.

All Officers required on Election Day have been recruited, trained and assigned to all the 28,992 polling stations.





THE ELECTION PROCESS

the pe

Our electoral system is stronger and more transparent than most electoral systems globally. Here is why:

[⊗]Our voters' register is fully biometric.

Seach voter also has a unique bar code.

Printing of our ballot paper, results declaration forms and collation sheets is monitored by all political parties, security agencies and EC officials.

Movement of electoral materials is monitored by all political parties and managed by security agencies.

On election day, our ballot box is fully transparent.

Severy voter is biometrically or manually verified before they vote.

Where manual verification, Presiding Officer must fill a form signed by the PO and the voter, and endorsed by agents at the polling station.



[®] The ballot paper given to the voter is validated by a stamp at the polling station.

The voter's bar code is deactivated after verification finger marked by indelible ink to prevent double voting.

Every register is unique to the Polling Station and a voter only appears on one register. This prevents double voting at different polling stations.

Tactile ballot jackets are provided for visually impaired voters to enable them vote independently and protect the secrecy of their ballot.

Polls are conducted in open public places and counting and declaration are done in the open as well.

At the end of the polls, officials and agents check to ensure that the number of people ticked on the register tallies with the number of voters biometrically and manually verified.

The entire process is closely observed by political party agents, candidate's agents, observers, journalists and members of the public.

At the end of the polls, the sorting of the ballot is done in the full glare of the public.

Counting will take place in public.

The declaration is done in public.

The recording of the results declared is done publicly.

Sector Agents are given copies of the results declared at the PS, CCC and NCC.

Transportation of the declared polling station results and ballot papers to the CCC is monitored by agents and security personnel.

At the CCC, before the collation begins, agents from the polling stations first confirm that the results being collated are exactly the same results declared at the polling station.

The collation is done in front of parliamentary candidates, their agents, spouses, journalists, observers, and security personnel.

At the end of the collation, the constituency results are declared in the presence of all.

At the NCC, candidates' agents will first confirm the figures before the Commission commences collation.

This year, additional integrity mechanisms have been introduced:



Section Results Transmission – all collated results will be captured into an electronic system projected at the CCC for confirmation by agents and transmitted to the NCC.

All Polling Station results will also be scanned and electronically transmitted to the NCC.

Election Officials & Party Agents have taken oaths before a Magistrate or Judicial officer instead of an officer of the Commission.

Solution Clear provisions in C.I. 94 regarding adjournment of polling in the event of a disruption caused by nature or human activity.

Serially numbered Statement of Polls and Declaration of the results sheets.

Sanctions in the law for election officials who negligently perform their work.

Manual verification introduced in addition to biometric verification.

Returning Officers will issue copies of collation sheets to Candidates/Agents.

We have expanded the list of special voters to include (accredited media personnel, security personnel and staff of the Elector Commission.)

WHAT TO EXPECT

Barring any unforeseen circumstances, expect materials to arrive at all polling stations on time.

Expect all the 28,992 polling stations to open from 7:00am and close at 5:00pm or after the last voter in the queue at 5:00pm votes.

VOTING STEPS Names Reference Table (Desk 1) Purpose To quickly identify voter in Voters Register (VR)

Process 1.Examine finger for traces of electoral stain.

2. Search for name using alphabetical order (ID Card extremely important for search)

3. Search first in name in Name Reference Lists (NRL) then in other Lists (exception, multiple & **STEPS** absent voters lists).

> 4. Inform Desk 2 (Verification officer) the page number and column in the VR and other lists where the voter's details can be found.

Verification Table (Desk 2) Purpose To Verify voter in Register Process

1.Locates Voter in **VR** using information from Desk 1.

2. Scans barcode of voter in **VR** using Biometric Voter Device (BVD)

3. Voter requested to put finger on scanner of BVD. Process repeated for all fingers if any fails.

Verification Table (Desk 2)

4. BVD shows a green light and a voice message "Verified" if finger matches, If there is no match, a red light will be shown with a voice message "rejected".

5. Destroy barcode in VR and apply indelible ink to little left finger.

Verification Table (Desk 2) Contd. Manual Verification Purpose

To Verify voter in case BVD fails to verify all 10 fingers.

Process

1.Inform agents of all political parties present at the polling station

2.Fill a manual verification form as provided in C.I. 94

3.Destroy barcode in VR and apply indelible ink to little left finger.

Ballot table (Desk 3) Purpose

To issue ballot to voter.

Process

1.Ballot paper is detached from booklet and validated

2.Instruction on how to fold the ballot paper vertically first, and then horizontally



3.Voter is directed to voting screen and the ballot box for both election.

NEW INTEGRITY MECHANISMS

INTEGRITY MECHANI SMS

Ballot issuers to hold up each ballot paper issued for scrutiny of all to ensure it is a single ballot paper and has been stamped before handing over to the voter.

Standardized Polling Station set up to minimize security threats and protect the secrecy of the ballot.

All Presiding Officers will be issued with gloves which must be worn before sorting of ballots and counting.

INTEGRITY MECHANI SMS

Results Collation Sheets (RSC) are serialized and personalized to each Polling Station.

Replacement sheets in the event of damage to RCS are also serially numbered and differentiated.

We are deploying 2 BVDs per polling station with additional spares at every District Office.

© Colour of the indelible ink will be different from the ink on the thumbprint pad. This is to help reduce the number of rejected ballots.

The ERTS is encrypted, making it impossible for anyone to decrypt and manipulate the results.

Agent Must:

Respect the right of voters at all times.

Solution himself/herself in a way that allows him/her to clearly see or hear whatever is going on and move freely at the polling station at all times.

Call the attention of the Presiding Officer to anything that he/she considers to be irregular and if possible, fill an irregularity form or give a written account of irregularity to the Presiding Officer.



The Agent must:

Solution State Assist the Presiding Officer at his/her request to establish the true identity of a prospective voter whose identity is in doubt.

Pay close attention to the ballots that are rejected.

for the people

Closely observe the counting of the votes, making sure that each ballot is counted in favour of the candidate for whom it was cast.



The Agent should:

Solution Ask for a recount if he genuinely thinks that the votes have not been counted correctly.

Sign the Declaration of Results Form, making sure that the total number of votes obtained by the candidates have been recorded properly and obtain a copy of the declaration form.

May refuse to sign the declaration form but must provide in writing, the reasons for such refusal.

What The Agent Must Not Do:

Solution No party or candidate colours or identification at the polling station

Must not interfere with election administration such as counting of the votes after the polls have closed.

 Cannot inspect the ID cards of voters in the queue.

Cannot directly confront any person in the polling station.



What The Agent Must Not Do:

Cannot assist a voter who needs help to vote.

Must not give orders to the election staff or in anyway interfere with or disrupt their work.

Cannot try to find out how someone is going to vote or has voted.

© Cannot handle any election material without the permission of the Presiding Officer.

Must not try to supervise the work of the pollins staff.


Measures to reduce rejected ballots:

We have tweaked the ballot paper design the boxes are larger and the separating lines are now thicker than before.

Different ink colour for indelible ink and thumb print pad.

The probability of election related violence is of great of concern to all Ghanaians.

23 incidents of violence during the Limited Voter Registration exercise.



Our offices vandalized and staff injured during transfer of votes exercise.



ELECTION SECURITY ISSUES

We have identified at least 81 constituencies as hotspots with the probability of election related violence.

The police has also identified over 5,000 polling stations as hotspots.

We have dialogued with leaders of political parties to hold their supporters in-check and use dialogue to resolve any issues they may have about any part of the process.


